### **Celebrating New Homeowners**

From construction to accounting and home buyer coaching, it's a team effort

Our new homeowners recently celebrated 50 years of marriage and early on, they bought their first home on Huron St. in Goshen. Now 50 years later, they are moving into their home on Huron St. in Elkhart! After many years of apartment living, they are most excited to have a home to plant a garden.

When Lacasa began work back in 2019 on a pilot program through Indiana Housing and Community Development Authority (IHCDA) designed to build new homes for income-qualified buyers, no one would have expected the economic conditions when the homes came to fruition. The very end of 2022 and into 2023 saw the com-

pletion of these homes and they went on the market; 4 homes in Goshen, and 4 in Elkhart. The cost of construction went up significantly from original projections three years earlier. Interest rates for buyers went up so our team dug in and found more subsidies for home buyers to be able to affordably purchase homes.

After months and countless hours working through hurdles, we are so pleased to have sold five of the eight homes, with pending offers on two more. See below with information on the remaining property being sold in Elkhart.

# Nearly \$4M Invested in our Community through IHCDA

Lt. Gov. Suzanne Crouch and the Board of Directors for the Indiana Housing and Community Development Authority (IHCDA) announced nine projects received awards from the HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME). This funding is utilized for the construction and/or rehabilitation of affordable rental housing for low and moderate-income individuals. Lacasa was selected to steward almost 25% of these dollars for Elkhart County, receiving three grants to create 15 new units of housing and rehab 12 more!

### New Affordable Housing Available in the Spring

In August, the ground was broken on Division Street in Elkhart, creating eight new affordable housing units. Families will be able to call this home in Spring 2024. The project was made possible through multiple partnerships, enabling us to create stronger foundations for all in our community.
